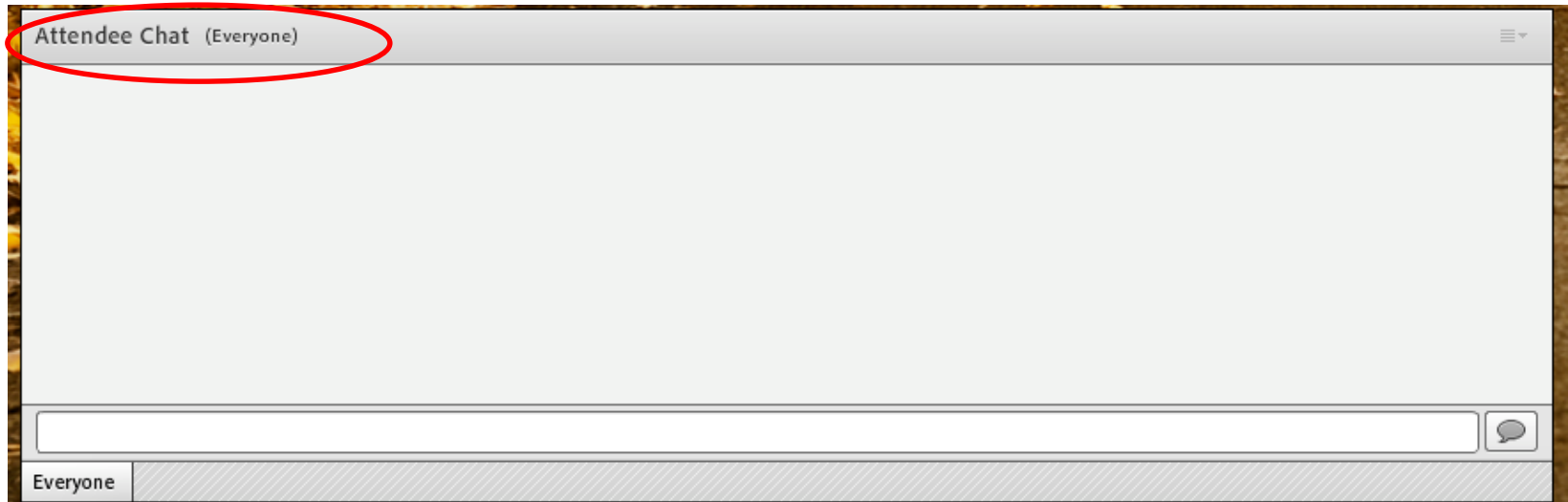

Children, Youth & Families

In 2014, the US Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) found that there are over 67,613 homeless families, representing 37% of all people experiencing homelessness (216,000 people), and including over 194,000 children and youth. This figure is likely a conservative estimate given that Local Education Agencies reported 1,258,182 homeless students during the 2012-13 school year of which 6% were unaccompanied. The emotional and physical effects of homelessness leave a lasting mark on children and youth due to trauma, poor nutrition, and delayed health care. From treatment guides to descriptions of the state of services, this page provides resources to help address the complex needs of children, youth, and families experiencing homelessness.
